Ever Wonder How Friends at Klamath Falls Make Decisions?

Here is a neat little discernment chart:

- You have a leading to do something or to make some change in the meeting. Pray about it to see if it rises to the point of saying something before going anywhere.
- If your leading is social or about peace issues or actions, go to Peace and Social Concerns, contact their clerk, get on their agenda, speak at their meeting about your concern or leading and they can bring it up to the meeting at the meeting for business.
- If your leading is about the pastor, that goes only to the pastor, Ministry and Care and/or the clerk of the meeting
- If your leading is about finances, the budget, or the building it goes to the stewardship committee. Contact their clerk and get on their agenda to discuss this or have it discussed. They will then see if they can bring it up at the next meeting for business.
- If your leading is about worship service, you can go to the pastor or the clerk.

Bayard Rustin was the architect of the Civil Rights Movement, but few people knew his name. He was gay, so therefore not spoken about often, yet he orchestrated the largest march of the time, The 1963 March on Washington.

Later, he met Walter Naegle, and Walter has worked tirelessly to get the achievements of Bayard Rustin known in his absence. This year Walter has been working with Barack Obama (producer) on the movie Rustin to make sure it was as accurate as Hollywood would allow.

Walter will be our special guest through ZOOM on Saturday April 20 at 4:00. We will be gathering at noon for a potluck to eat together and watch a movie about Bayard Rustin. But we are all looking forward to 4PM when we can find out firsthand about Bayard Rustin and his life as the civil rights leader .
