• *Xeriscaping Peace Supper with a lecture provided by* Nicole Sanchez of Oregon State University to be held with dinner provided, September 14, 2024 at 6pm. It is Free, appropriate for all ages, and food is provided. Nicole Sanchez of Oregon State University will be speaking on the practice of xeriscaping, a landscaping technique that uses extremely low levels of water. With xeriscaping you can reduce or even eliminate the need for irrigation. Knowledge of local plants and plants that require little water offer great advantages in terms of reduced labor and expenses. *With xeriscaping you will not need to be constantly* watering, mowing, fertilizing, and reseeding a lawn. While you may be using different plants than you are used to in gardening, a variety of beautiful and hardy plants are available.
