They are so happy to have Henley Key Club students and KU DECA students join the volunteers and help clients carry out their groceries. What great young people they are!*
- Klamath Interfaith Food Pantry's Thanksgiving Meal Box sign-up was a huge success--70 families requested these special meal boxes. Linda distributed these request forms to congregations. Please open your hearts (and pocketbooks), "adopt a family," and make their Thanksgiving holiday extra special.
