Some say Love, it is a river that drowns the tender reed.



Interfaith Food Pantry update for December: The Interfaith Food Pantry served 56 households, 124 people total (83 adults and 41 children). 35 volunteers (with 6 new volunteers) gave 184 hours of their time during a very busy time of year.

The sponsoring congregations donated 537 pounds of food, 258 pounds came from Hope Lutheran thanks to grants and donations

totaling \$290. However, the pantry is now nearly depleted. They need donations of both food and cash to purchase food, especially since our January pantry is almost five weeks away.
